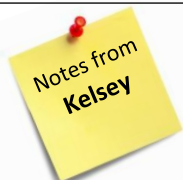

Richard comes into the role of Rural Advisor after 22 years in the NZ Police, 14 of these last years working as the Te Awamutu Community Constable.

Richard has a long involvement with Neighbourhood Support, having been a member of the NSNZ Board as the Waikato District Representative and more recently as an Executive Sub-Committee member.

Richard was instrumental in setting up CommSafe, an organisation who revitalised the local Neighbourhood Support Network and started Community Patrol in the Te Awamutu district.

Starting in October, Richard hit the ground running, with a visit to the Southern District to work alongside NZ Police, FMG, Federated Farmers and Farlanders to assist with the delivery of Rural Stakeholder Meetings.

Some will say that it was a 'moment of madness', others a 'rash moment', either way the Alexandra and Clyde Neighbourhood Support Group decided to enter a 'Florrey' (a decorated New World shopping trolley) in the Alexandra Blossom Festival parade. After a great many laughs, paper and glue for miles and 70 hours later, 'a shoe' was created – next task was to find an 'old women'.

Dressed for the occasion and walking along with the 'old women' were several local children and the local constable carrying Neighbourhood Support Bags.

For their efforts, the Alexandra and Clyde Neighbourhood Support Group won the Florrey section, receiving \$150.00 New World Voucher, along with local newspaper and national television coverage making it to the evening news.

The Alexandra Blossom Festival celebrated 60 years and is the longest running parade in New Zealand.
